


Spy Story! Our March 25th Meeting

The San Diego Chapter continues to present outstanding meetings with truly exceptional speakers. Our March meeting was a great success and our primary speaker, former U.S. Attorney Robert Brewer, Jr. kept the audience spellbound with his spy story on the 1981 prosecution of Marion Zacharski, a deeply embedded Soviet spy, who obtained Top Secret documents pertaining to radar systems from Hughes Aircraft

Company.

Mr. Brewer prosecuted the case and he discussed the investigation, arrest, trial and later interview with 60 Minutes. Zacharski was the "handler" for another spy, William Bell, who was arrested and wore a "wire" to gather evidence on Zacharski. As part of a plea deal. Zacharski was later traded for 23 Western spies and 26 years later the prosecutor and spy were reunited to discuss the trial. Mr. Brewer's presentation will set a high bar for future meeting as he received a standing ovation at the end of his presentation. *Right, the spy William Bell*

- If you served in a combat zone and if so, which and the dates.
- If you served during the Viet Nam war era (1955-1975).
- If you been awarded the SAR Military or War Service Medal, Please let us know.

We plan to have a special ceremony in November 2023 and also will list all our veterans in our monthly SAR Digest. *Please respond to Rob ASAP.*

We, as a patriotic organization honor all who have served and protected that which our ancestors fought so hard and gave up so much. Every veteran in the our Chapter should be recognized with either the **War Service Medal** or the **Military Service Medal**. It is very simple to apply for this recognition, just follow the steps below.

- 1. Simply download this form: "<u>Veterans Multi-Corps Recognition Form</u>" and fill in the required information.
- Military "Proof of Service," will be required. This can be from military documentation or in the form of a redacted copy of the member's discharge, typically a form DD-214. Such proof must show that the Compatriot served, or is serving, honorably in: (1) the armed forces of the United States, (2) the military forces of a country allied with the United States, or (3) a United Nations Peace Keeping Force. War Service will be documented in the DD-214.

JROTC Winner, SDSAR and CASSAR



Members earn points for each presentation which are accumulated for America 250 medals and awards (see the link below for more information).
