


live drawing caricatures of five recent Presidents.

# Why is Meeting Signup So Important

We realize that our need for signup and pre-payment along with early signup cutoff can be confusing, hopefully this brief article will provide some clarity. Our signup requirements are driven by the venue rather than our policy. The venues we are using this year *require* a minimum serving in order to utilize their meeting rooms. This means that the Chapter must pay for a minimum number of meals and if the attendance is below the minimum then the additional funds must come from the Chapter funds.

Some venues now require a firm head count about a week before the meeting. This is why we often have a cutoff date in our meeting announcements and why we now begin signup a week earlier. The venues will always attempt to serve any extras over our signup list but there might be times when the meal choice will be limited.

For the above reasons we discourage the "pay at the door" option. Our most common "no shows" are those that elected to pay at the door however the Chapter is still charged if we provided a head count to the venue that includes "no shows" and attendance falls short.

Our goal is to break even on our meetings so our pricing has no padding to cover a shortfall. On an annual basis we achieved this goal in 2022 and are on track to do the same in 2023. Our attendance has been strong despite the inflation driven higher prices from our venues. We would love to return to the Rancho Bernardo Country Club but they impose a minimum attendance of 40 which we cannot currently meet. We thank you for your support and are working this year on providing great venues and speakers.

# **Calling all Veterans**

We, as a patriotic organization honor all who have served and protected that which our ancestors fought so hard and gave up so much. Every veteran in the our Chapter should be recognized with either the **War Service Medal** or the **Military Service Medal**. It is very simple to apply for this recognition, just follow the steps below.

- 1. Simply download this form: "<u>Veterans Multi-Corps Recognition Form</u>" and fill in the required information.
- 2. Military "Proof of Service," will be required. This can be from military documentation or in the form of a redacted copy of the member's discharge, typically a form DD-214. Such proof must show that the Compatriot served, or is serving, honorably in: (1) the armed forces of the United States, (2) the military forces of a country allied with the United States, or (3) a United Nations Peace Keeping Force. War Service will be documented in the DD-214.
