## **Memorial Day Weekend Events**




We supported the House of USA in Balboa Park with our Color Guard for their program on Sunday.



The **"250 Minute"** refers to brief presentations given by members on topics related to the <u>Revolutionary War Period</u>. Members earn points for each presentation which are accumulated for America 250 medals and awards (see the link below for more information).
