Hannah White Arnett (1733-1823) was an American woman who is known for preventing a group of men in Elizabethtown (now Elizbeth),

"protection of life and Property." When she heard the men, meeting in her house, talking about this offer, she called them Coward and Traitors. The men eventually refused the offer of the British.

Wreaths Across America




