Presidents Message from the January Business Meeting

We begin the new year with a cautionary message that our Chapter's revenue will likely suffer a major decline in 2024. In 2023 we enjoyed over \$4,500 in income from our Wreaths Across America program that was paid to us for the 2022 Wreaths program (the bulk of this money comes in after the new year). This tremendous fundraising was due to our coordinator, Kristene Reardon, who moved to North Carolina in 2023 and while she continued her efforts on our behalf we could not find a member that would work with her for local personal visits and follow-ups. She also reported that most the contacts she made in 2022 were not purchasing or not as many wreaths as they did in 2022. Based on our 2023 purchases we anticipate a reduction of well over \$3,000 in income from this program.

We are not immune to the ravages of inflation as our black powder insurance is almost \$1,700 per year and our storage costs are almost \$2,400 per year. Meetings are harder to plan as venue and food costs have gone up dramatically. Clearly we have work to do this year.

Goals for 2024

- 1. **Secure new avenues of fundraising**. Our chapter has shrunk, and our financial needs have grown over the years, and we cannot rely on our annual dues to cover our costs. We are in dire need of a Wreaths Across America lead that can devote time and energy to this program. Not only is it a worthy program, but it has also been the major source of funding for our chapter until 2023. I implore any member that might be interested in taking on this role to please contact me.
- 2. **Establish a program of investment that leads to a steady source of funding for our chapter's needs**. This is a long-term approach that will have its greatest impact several years from now. Our first such investment will be the "Pendleton Fund" named after Major General (USMC) Joseph H. Pendleton who was our Chapters 18th President and served two terms in 1929 and 1930. Funds collected for this endeavor are set aside for the purpose of investing and using the earnings to provide an ongoing source to fund our Youth Programs which we hope to fully fund at some point in the future. This fund was approved by last year's Board and is now active on our website's Donation page.
- 3. **Build our membership**. We made good progress in 2022 and 2023 attracting new members (16) and we must continue to attract and mentor new members for our Chapter to thrive. We cannot rely on a small group of members to take on leadership roles before they become weary of the role. Our newer members are our best source of new leadership for our chapter and I ask all members to embrace our new members, mentor and support them while encouraging their participation in our chapter and our programs.
- 4. **Establish a membership outreach program**. We have a lot of members that we have not heard from in years. Many of these are Life members but even more are regular members that always renew their membership. I will work with our Membership VP to establish regular personal contact with these members. This could take the form of volunteer members making phone calls or personal visits a couple of times per year. If you would be willing to participate, please contact me as I hope we can get this started in the first quarter of the year.
- 5. **Continue to strengthen our relationship with the Daughters of the American Revolution**. In 2022 our then President Michael Hirman began working on repairing our relationship with DAR which had become strained over the prior years. Peter Fagen continued that last year and I plan to build on their success in 2024. To that end I ask that our Chapter members attend one or more meetings each year with a nearby DAR Chapter. Those of us that have attended their meetings have all found they are a welcoming organization to our members just as we are to them. We look forward to working together on programs of mutual interest this year. DAR is very involved in our upcoming George Washington Birthday Dinner as they have agreed to take on the table and room decorations as well as put together and run the door prize drawing with the funds raised used to reduce the cost of hosting the event.

January Business Meeting

The San Diego Chapter held its annual Business meeting on January 20, 2024, at the Broken Yolk in Carmel Mountain Ranch. We had an excellent crowd that saw two new members inducted and one new Dual member recognized. In addition to a lot of awards presented we updated our Bylaws with a unanimous vote, a 2024 budget summary was provided, and we installed our 2024 Board of Directors and welcomed three new members.


