Have you completed the SAR Youth Protection Training? Future of Chapter Meetings

We are finding it increasingly difficult to locate meeting venues that have a reasonable cost and a minimum attendance guarantee that would work for our Chapter. Venues are now adding "room fees" that range from \$250 to over \$1,000 before the food cost! Many have raised their guaranteed servings to 50 or more which is well beyond our common meeting attendance and typical "add-on" fees and tax add another 50% to the food cost.

To continue with regular meetings, we are going to have to make changes. One proposal is to hold only one meeting per quarter with a plated meal service and other meetings would have items like coffee & pastry for breakfast and deli sandwiches for lunch meetings that would held in low or no cost venues. We had hoped to have one more dinner meeting this year but the prices we have encountered would put the price of such to over \$50 per person often higher.
